To amend the Controlled Substances Act to provide for the death penalty for anyone who knowingly deals fentanyl to a person who dies from the use of such fentanyl.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Deal Death, Face
5 Death Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. DEATH SENTENCE FOR FENTANYL.**

7 Section 401(b)(1)(C) of the Controlled Substances
8 Act (21 U.S.C. 841(b)(1)(C)) which is amended by insert-

1 ing after “In the case of a controlled substance in schedule
2 I or II, gamma hydroxybutyric acid (including when sched-
3 uled as an approved drug product for purposes of section
4 3(a)(1)(B) of the Hillory J. Farias and Samantha Reid
5 Date-Rape Drug Prohibition Act of 2000), or 1 gram of
6 flunitrazepam, except as provided in subparagraphs (A),
7 (B), and (D), such person shall be sentenced to a term
8 of imprisonment of not more than 20 years and if death
9 or serious bodily injury results from the use of such sub-
10 stance shall be sentenced to a term of imprisonment of
11 not less than twenty years or more than life, a fine not
12 to exceed the greater of that authorized in accordance with
13 the provisions of title 18, United States Code, or
14 \$1,000,000 if the defendant is an individual or \$5,000,000
15 if the defendant is other than an individual, or both.” the
16 following: “If any person commits such a violation with
17 respect to a controlled substance that contains any quan-
18 tity of fentanyl or a fentanyl-related substance, such per-
19 son shall be sentenced, if death results from the use of
20 such substance, to death, a fine not to exceed the greater
21 of twice that authorized in accordance with the provisions
22 of title 18, United States Code, or \$2,000,000 if the de-
23 fendant is an individual or \$10,000,000 if the defendant
24 is other than an individual, or both.”.
