To prohibit adverse action against a member of the Armed Forces who refuses to receive a vaccination against COVID-19, and for other purposes.

- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-1
- tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as the "Service Restoration 4
- 5 Act".

1	SEC. 2. PROTECTIONS FOR MEMBERS OF THE ARMED
2	FORCES WHO REFUSE TO RECEIVE VACCINA-
3	TIONS AGAINST COVID-19.
4	(a) Prohibitions.—
5	(1) Federal funding.—No Federal funds
6	may be used to require a member of the Armed
7	Forces to receive a vaccination against COVID-19.
8	(2) Adverse action.—The Secretary con-
9	cerned may not take any adverse action against a
10	member of the Armed Forces solely on the basis that
11	such member refuses to receive a vaccination against
12	COVID-19.
13	(b) Reinstatement.—
14	(1) Requirement.—At the election of a cov-
15	ered individual, the Secretary concerned shall rein-
16	state such covered individual—
17	(A) as a member of the Armed Force con-
18	cerned; and
19	(B) in the grade held by such covered indi-
20	vidual immediately before the involuntary sepa-
21	ration of the covered individual.
22	(2) Computation of retired or retainer
23	PAY.—In the case of an covered individual reinstated
24	as a member of the Armed Forces under paragraph
25	(1), the Secretary concerned shall include, in the
26	computation of retired or retainer pay for such cov-

1	ered individual, the time between the involuntary
2	separation of such covered individual and such rein-
3	statement.
4	(c) Expungement.—The Secretary concerned shall
5	expunge, from the service record of a covered individual
6	or a member of the Armed Forces who received an adverse
7	action solely on the basis of such member to receive a vac-
8	cination against COVID-19, each reference to involuntary
9	separation, or to adverse action, solely on such basis.
10	(d) Definitions.—In this section:
11	(1) The term "adverse action" includes the fol-
12	lowing:
13	(A) Retaliation.
14	(B) Punishment.
15	(C) Disparate treatment.
16	(D) A requirement to wear a mask.
17	(E) A requirement to reside in sub-
18	standard housing.
19	(2) The term "covered individual" means an in-
20	dividual involuntarily separated from the Armed
21	Forces solely on the basis of the refusal of such indi-
22	vidual to receive a vaccination against COVID-19.
23	(3) The term "Secretary concerned" has the
24	meaning given that term in section 101 of title 10,
25	United States Code.
